CCDF Overview



Provides subsidies for low-income working families with children under the age of 13



Allows Lead Agencies flexibility in developing child care programs and policies



Promotes parental choice in choosing child care that best suits their family's needs, while also promoting health and safety





CCDF Requirements

Lead Agencies must:



Provide at least 12 months of eligibility per child.



Have a sliding fee scale.



Support parental choice by ensuring all families are offered the option of a voucher.



Keep co-payments the same within the 12-month eligibility period (with the exception of graduated phaseout at redetermination).



Limit co-payments to 7% of family income or less.





CCDF Flexibilities



Eligibility periods longer than 12 months



Sliding fee scale factors



Ways to support parental choice



Definitions for work, education, and training, children receiving or needing protective services



Income limits for applicants and individuals in a graduated phaseout period (if applicable)



Sliding fee scale percentages of income below 7%

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Income Reporting Requirements





CCDF Income Eligibility Requirements



The Lead Agency must require families to report if their income has exceeded 85% SMI.



A child meeting the eligibility requirements at the last determination or redetermination continues to receive subsidies at least at the same level. If the family's income changes, subsidies continue unless the change exceeds 85% of SMI.



During the graduated phaseout, the Lead Agency may require additional reporting or changes in family income for gradual adjustment of family co-payments.





CCDF Eligibility Verification Flexibilities



The Lead Agency has the flexibility to determine the *source of income* for CCDF eligibility and the verification requirements for income.



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Family-friendly Practices





CCDF Requirements

Lead Agencies must include in their CCDF Plan:



Definitions for eligibility, including terms like "special needs child," "physical or mental incapacity," "attending job training or educational programs," "residing with," "working," etc.



A description of eligibility determination and redetermination processes to promote continuity of care.





Family-friendly Applications



Online Subsidy Applications (strongly encouraged)

- Can be more convenient and less stressful for parents
- Particularly useful in reducing the burden of document submission



OCC's Family-friendly Application Guide

- Provides info on how to define, verify, and collect eligibility information
- Guidelines for designing successful online application
- Considerations for maintaining program integrity




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

Family-friendly Application Best Practices

Short, simple, plain-language application form

Mobile-friendly application with photo upload for documents

One application for many programs

Minimal documents required to apply

Easy tools to find out what programs exist that applicant might qualify for

Proactive outreach notifying applicant of programs that might help

Simple and accessible layout

Collect only information that is required



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Ensuring Stable Care





Payment Practices Requirements

Lead Agencies must:



Ensure timeliness of payment to the child care providers by paying in advance of or at the beginning of delivery of services.



Support the fixed costs of providing child care services by delinking provider payments from a child's occasional absences, by basing payment on a child's authorized enrollment.



Pay providers on a parttime or full-time basis.



Pay for reasonable mandatory registration fees that the provider charges to private-paying parents.





Hours of Care Flexibilities

The Lead Agency is:



Not required to limit authorized services strictly based on the work, training, or education schedule of the parent(s).



Not required to limit authorized services to the number of hours the parent(s) spends at work, training, or educational activities.





Continuity of Care Requirements

Lead Agencies must:



Take into consideration children's development and learning.



Promote continuity of care when authorizing child care services.





Continuity of Care Requirements

Lead Agencies must continue assistance at the same level despite:



Changes in family income that do not exceed 85% SMI.



Temporary changes in activities.



Changes in age.



Changes in residency within the state.



Loss of activity (for at least three months per instance).
