This interactive session will focus on using quality investments to increase the capacity and quality of the infant/toddler workforce.

1:30–2:30 p.m.	Topic Session Creative Problem-Solving Through Human-Centered Design Human-centered design is a problem-solving approach that helps with understanding and honoring the experiences of people served while working toward solutions. Participants should come with a problem in mind that they've been struggling to solve. Participants will work with facilitators and peers to explore ways that engage people with lived experience, increasing their understanding of problems, design solutions, and implementation.		

2:30–3:30 p.m.	Infants and Toddlers Have Unique Needs Infants and toddlers have unique developmental needs, and systematic changes meant to impact them must take this into account. This session will integrate data at multiple levels so that participants can practice applying research and evidence to system design and evaluation with an infant/toddler lens.
